		<p><b>Coughs and sneezes</b></p> <p><b>Social distancing</b> We expect parents and staff to behave in a socially responsible manner, to ensure the safety of themselves, their children and all at Jumblies Day Nursery.</p> <p><b>Cleaning of rooms and resources</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All resources that have been used are cleaned every day.</li> <li>• Surfaces are wiped down regularly and at the end of every day.</li> <li>• Floors are vacuumed and moped daily.</li> <li>• All curtains and carpets are sprayed daily with antibacterial spray.</li> <li>• Carpets are steam cleaned weekly.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hand sanitiser is provided across the setting.</li> <li>• Teach <b>children</b> to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands.</li> <li>• Tissues will be made available throughout the workplace.</li> <li>• Minimising contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend the setting. 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		<p><b>Symptoms of Covid-19</b></p> <p>If anyone becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a temperature in Nursery they must be sent home and advised to follow the staying at home guidance.</p> <p>If a child is awaiting collection, they should be moved into the outside area. If it is not possible to isolate them, move them to an area which is at least 2 metres away from other people.</p> <p>If they need to go to the bathroom while waiting to be collected, they should use a separate bathroom if possible, which will be cleaned thoroughly before another person uses it.</p>	<p><b>Children with a temperature</b></p> <p>and/or a new cough will not be allowed in the nursery.</p> <p>Children's well being will be closely observed throughout the day. If any concerns arise the parent/carer will be contacted and asked to pick up the child immediately.</p> <p>Internal communication channels and cascading of messages through line managers will be carried out regularly to reassure and support employees in a fast-changing situation.</p> <p>Line managers will offer support to staff who are affected by Coronavirus or has a family member affected.</p>	<p>All staff are responsible to be aware of changes in children's health throughout the day and to inform the person in charge of these changes.</p>

		<p><b>The bathroom should be cleaned and</b> disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else.</p> <p>In an emergency, call 999 if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk. Do not visit the GP, pharmacy, urgent care centre or a hospital.</p> <p>If a member of staff has helped someone who was taken unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, they do not need to go home unless they develop symptoms themselves. They should wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after any contact with someone who is unwell. Cleaning with normal household disinfectant after someone with symptoms has left will reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people</p> <p>Line managers will maintain regular contact with staff members/parent of child during this time.</p> <p><b>A confirmed case of Covid 19 in the setting</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If a member of staff or a child has been tested positive for Covid 19 the setting will contact the local Health authority, who will work with the setting to guide them through the actions they need to take.</li> </ul>	<p>We are following Governments current guidance of not measuring children's temperature when entering the setting, but will check their temperature if in doubt.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parents and carers will be kept informed throughout this process.</li> </ul>	<p>Manager</p>
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
