Additional Controls

Employees and children to be reminded on a regular basis to wash their hands for 20 seconds with warm water and soap and the importance of proper drying. Rigorous checks will be carried out by

managers to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed.

Hand sanitizer is provided across the setting.

Children will wash their hands on arrival, before, after toileting, before and after they play outdoors and before they go home.

Teach children to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues - Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands. Tissues will be made available throughout the workplace.

Minimising contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend the setting.

Uniform

Staff will wear black trousers and uniform top. Staff using public transport get changed into their uniform once in Jumblies. When staff finish work, they are to remove their uniform, place in a pillowcase and wash on the highest temperature permitted for that type of fabric. Staff are also to shower as soon as they get home. These steps are to be taken daily to minimise the chance of cross infection.

Non-essential visitors will not be permitted access to the Nursery during the pandemic. Any visits will be re-scheduled until a later

Parents have been regularly communicated to throughout. Individual's will be supported on a case by case basis where required. This includes SEND children. Direction to latest government guidance will be provided.

Cleaning

Staff to be reminded on a daily basis of the importance of social distancing both in the workplace and outside of it. Management checks to ensure this is adhered to wherever possible

Children will be kept in bubbles in their own area of the room with designated members of staff. (see procedures)+

PPE

Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of PPE as a requirement of 1 job (for example gloves for nappy changing), an adequate supply of the will be provided. Staff will be instruc on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely.

Aprons and facemasks are available, these should be used when looking a child who becomes unwell whilst at nursery.

Symptoms of Covid-19

If anyone becomes unwell with a necontinuous cough or a high temperature in Nursery they must be sent home and advised to follow staying at home guidance.

If a child is awaiting collection, they should be moved, if possible, to a rowhere they can be isolated behind a closed door, with appropriate adult supervision. Ideally, a window shoul be opened for ventilation. If it is not possible to isolate them, move them an area which is at least 2 metres av from other people.

If they need to go to the bathroom

Managers to ensure availability, all staff to ensure responsible use and disposal of PPE.

All staff are responsible to be aware of changes in children's health throughout the day and to inform the person in charge of these changes.

while waiting to be collected, they should use a separate bathroom if possible.

The bathroom should be cleaned ar disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyolelse.

In an emergency, call 999 if they ar seriously ill or injured or their life is risk. Do not visit the GP, pharmacy, urgent care centre or a hospital. If a member of staff has helped someone who was taken unwell wi new, continuous cough or a high temperature, they do not need to § home unless they develop symptor themselves. They should wash thei hands thoroughly for 20 seconds at any contact with someone who is unwell. Cleaning with normal household disinfectant after somed with symptoms has left will reduce risk of passing the infection on to o people

Line managers will maintain regula contact with staff members/parent child during this time.
